1. Approval of minutes:

- a. Unanimous approval of the January 16th meeting.
- b. No quorum was achieved at the last posted meeting on January 23 so that the meeting was not called to order.

2. Status update on WG+E pole walkout and network design

- a. Status update on contracts:
 - Pole attachment contracts prepared for both Grid and Verizon.
 These are in legal review.
- b. Status update on mapping
 - Received new updated maps from PVC. Most house number updates have been resolved. A short list of map updates have been sent back to WG&E to update. Waiting for updated maps to confirm.
- c. Status of the make-ready reimbursement guidelines
 - i. These have not yet been issued.
- d. Design prep: Checking the information about the fiber counts for build out
 - i. Trevor has developed some Excel "maps" to get a fiber count.
 - ii. The maps are electronic and allow us to adjust counts as we go.
 - iii. Consider how we should handle campgrounds as a single commercial entity that re-broadcasts to the camp?
 - iv. Doug has followed up with DCR to provide service to Mohawk Trail State Park but has not yet had a reply.
 - v. Ken will follow up regarding the impact of traffic calming

3. Status update on Network Equipment Enclosure

- a. Members reviewed the proposed space in the basement.
- b. Bob has put together a "packet" for WG&E review and will check on this during our weekly check in.

4. Review and approve the draft document outlining the pros and cons of the evaluated network solutions

- a. Committee voted to approve the document subject to an introductory paragraph and checking the numbers for the posted Matrix/ Crocker proposals.
 - i. Yes unanimous.

- 5. Review and approve draft communication update language for the website.
 - a. Members agreed to review and comment on this before our meeting next week.
- 6. Develop policy guideline recommendations for network service
 - a. Discussed the need to understand the cost and conditions of installing wireless network extensions as a part of the policy guidelines.
 - i. Committee voted to ask Sean if we can research wireless network extensions: what is needed for installation and how this might work with our chosen fiber network operator and ISP.
