#### **Broadband News**

The town of Charlemont is offering a new subsidy for broadband subscribers who qualify for the federal Lifeline program.

Starting in July, all Charlemont residents who receive Lifeline through Whip City Fiber will receive an additional \$30/month subsidy on their internet bills. This town subsidy is in addition to the \$9.25 subsidy from Lifeline.

If you are currently receiving Lifeline on your Whip City Fiber internet bill, you will be automatically enrolled in this program. You will see the additional credit starting with your July bill.

If you are currently using Lifeline for a different service, then you can qualify for the \$30 discount by switching your Lifeline credit to Whip City Fiber. The \$9.25 Lifeline subsidy can be applied only to a single provider and most telephone or internet plans are eligible.

You may qualify automatically under federal guidelines if you already receive benefits such as SNAP, SSI, MEDICAID or other similar federal assistance programs.

# **Bridge Projects**

Bridge Projects continue South River Road and East Oxbow Road. The South River Road project is going to be several weeks, a section of beam loss in the bridge substructure required the closure for repairs.

East Oxbow Road Bridge is a full replacement, with work this summer to install a temporary bridge beside the current bridge. Once the temporary bridge is in place the current bridge will be demolished in place and a new one will be built. ### **Extreme Heat Resources**

Extreme heat can be dangerous and even life-threatening if precautions are not taken. During prolonged periods of very hot weather, which may include high humidity, the body must work harder to stay cool, increasing the risk of heat-related illness. While anyone can be affected, **older adults**, **young children**, **pregnant individuals**, **workers exposed to excessive heat**, **and people with chronic medical conditions** are especially vulnerable. Taking preventive steps—like staying hydrated, avoiding strenuous activity, and seeking cooler environments—can help protect community members during periods of extreme heat.
