Summer food access can be difficult for families whose children eat regularly at school cafeterias or simply because fresh produce can be pricey. Local options for meals for those under 18 are on Project Bread's website: projectbread.org.



SUMMER EATS, run in partnership with the Massachusetts
Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, is a totally free meal program providing meals to children and teens 0-18 years.

Healthy food access

The ability to get healthy food is often blocked by barriers such as price, physical distance to stores, or a lack of nutrient-rich food at stores close to home. In the summer months, however, the convenience of farm stands and farmers' markets can offer increased access to fresh produce. A map of local farm stands can be found on the website of the nonprofit Community Involved in Sustaining Agriculture (CISA) buylocalfood.org.

Additionally, Massachusetts developed a creative solution to increasing food access and helping strengthen local farms: the Healthy Incentives Program (HIP). The program works alongside SNAP benefits (formerly food stamp dollars): anyone who is eligible for <u>any amount</u> these benefits has at least "an extra" \$40 dollars a month (as an instant, automatic refund) that can be used on produce and other food items without preservatives. HIP dollars are widely used year-round at farmers markets and benefit local farmers!

Only certain retailers accept HIP, so check out CISA's website buylocalfood.org for information on where to redeem HIP. Or, chat up your local farmer at the market!

COVID-19 Vaccine and **Booster Clinics this summer**

There are five, no-cost COVID-19 vaccination and booster clinics scheduled across Franklin County in August. Vaccines will be available for those aged 6 months and older and boosters are available for those aged 5 years and older, including 2nd boosters. All vaccine types (Moderna, Pfizer, J&J) will be available. Eligibility information can be found at mass.gov/covid-19-vaccine.

For all clinics: Register online via frcog.org/covid under the "vaccination" tab. Walk-ins welcome. Please bring an ID, as well as an insurance card or vaccination card, if you have them.

Through a state-wide program, anyone aged 12 and older will be given a \$25 gift card for their first COVID-19 vaccination!

We still have at-home COVID-19 Tests Available!

Positive COVID cases are still being reported for the town of Charlemont, which means that COVID-19 is out there. In the case that you're exposed, the Board of Health has a limited number of at-home test kits (2 tests per kit) available at no cost to you!
